CCL aims to acknowledge and strengthen the tools and knowledge of individuals to critically analyse and engage with cultural practices. It focuses on the inclusion of marginalized voices and perspectives, emphasizing the need to understand and challenge dominant European and national cultural narratives.

Critical cultural literacy is a human ability. As their everyday lives are already saturated and shaped by cultural and artistic forms of expression, humans are always already culturally literate. CCL promotes participation in activities of diverse cultural communities in addition to the

creation of common living spaces and co-creation of culture. This framework is crucial in today's diverse and interconnected world, where individuals navigate and interpret a wide array of cultural expressions and power dynamics.

It encourages questioning and analyzing the power relations that shape cultural and artistic production and dissemination, challenging the status quo to discover alternative pathways for social and self-development.

3. MULTILITERACY:

CCL extends beyond print media to include various forms of cultural and artistic expressions, such as visual, electronic, and performative arts. This approach helps democratize cultural production and recognizes the diverse linguistic, social, economic, artistic and cultural capital that learners bring to their educational experiences.

4. EMANCIPATORY EDUCATION:

The ultimate goal of CCL is to provide an emancipatory educational experience that supports individuals and communities to advocate for social change and justice. It encourages a reflective and self-critical approach to education, ensuring that both educators and learners are conscious of the power structures inherent in their interactions.
